National Industrial Chemical Notification Scheme - (NICNAS) Customs Broker Seminar

Why NICNAS is running this Seminar:

The National Industrial Chemicals Notification Scheme (NICNAS) is the Australian Government's Regulatory Scheme for industrial chemicals. Under the scheme all importers and/or manufacturers of industrial chemicals for commercial purposes must register with NICNAS - regardless of the quantity of industrial chemicals imported and/or manufactured.

In addition, the Rotterdam Convention on the Prior Informed Consent Procedure for Certain Hazardous Chemicals and Pesticides in International Trade (Rotterdam Convention) places obligations on the importers and exporters of specific chemicals.

By attending this Seminar, you will gain a better understanding of the importer and exporter obligations under the *Industrial Chemicals (Notification and Assessment) Act 1989* (the Act) administered by the Australian Government National Industrial Chemicals Notification and Assessment Scheme (NICNAS).

The Seminar will explain how NICNAS Registration operates, including NICNAS Registration Tier levels, and advise on what your clients need to do to ensure compliance with their obligations under the Act.
